Spellings

Children will be tested on Mondays
We have changed the way we are setting spellings. The children will <u>all</u> learn the first 5 spellings but then the next 5 will depend on the spelling group they are in.
These groups are not fixed and your child may move between the groups depending on how they are doing in the tests. The results to their tests will be sent home every week so you can see how they are doing.

<u>Maths</u>

This week's homework is again based on fractions work we have been doing in class. Children need to find the equivalent fractions from the sheet provided remembering that in fractions 'whatever you do to the top (N) you do to the bottom (D)'

Numerator (N) = number at the top of a fraction which says how many parts.

Denominator (D) = number at the bottom of a fraction which says how many parts are in one whole.
