We have had a wonderful half term and have been delighted with the hard work the children have put into their 'Once upon a Time' topic. It has generated a lot of interest in well-known tales and has allowed the children the opportunity to develop their speaking and listening, reading and writing skills. It has also allowed us to teach the children practical skills in maths and to develop their skills in using and applying estimating and measuring skills as well as to help the children use positional language in meaningful contexts. We thank you for your ongoing support with all of the Parent in Partnership tasks and for the way you have continued to help your child develop their phonic knowledge and to use their phonics to help them progress in reading.

Topic news

Next half term our topic is entitled, 'Get, Set, Grow.' Within our work with the children we will focus on developing skills across the curriculum. We will be using the outdoor environment to help us learn about nature and the living world around us. We will also discuss ways that we can care for our world and will be starting to plant seeds and to care for them in order to observe how they change and grow. If you are able to go out on a nature walk with your child during the holidays and discuss the natural world and how we care for it, this will be really beneficial to our work.

We will continue with practical measuring using non-standard units and will continue to develop the children's skills in estimating. Using the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' as a stimulus, we will develop our oracy skills through storytelling activities and will use the story to help us learn about settings and characters in stories. By using the story in such a way, we intend to develop the children's reading and writing skills as they write about story events, settings and characters.

When working on 'g,' please use the following vocabulary,

'Up the hill, over the top, STOP. All the way back round, again, down, down, down under the line and loop the loop.'
By using this language, you will reinforce our work at school and help your child form their letters.

Encourage your child to use a range of tools. If they find manipulating smaller tools difficult at this time, perhaps work with water and paintbrushes in the garden, or paint and paint brushes on large sheets of paper. Rainbow writing is also fun, so a range of colourful felt tips or colouring pencils could be used.
