

We have started our topic of 'Growing Up and Moving On,' by learning about the Life Cycle of a Butterfly this week. We have learned about each stage of the cycle and have worked on sequencing activities and writing work linked to this topic.

To help the children understand this life cycle, we have learned this song, sung to the tune of 'She'll be coming round the mountain when she comes.' You might like to sing it at home.

Maths

This week we have continued to practise counting in 10s, 5s and 2s.

We have also worked on practical weighing and measuring of length and height. To help your child with this work, please set up the following activity at home. Cut lengths of string or ribbon of different lengths. Ask your child to find objects in the garden that are

longer shorter taller the same length or height

as their 'caterpillar.'

Extension

Using a non-standard measure such as straws, penny coins or lego bricks etc... ask the children to measure their string or ribbon caterpillar. This will help the children consolidate their learning from this week.

Some of the children have worked on double numbers and have learned to double and record their understanding of doubling through writing numbers or drawing pictures. Any work on doubling numbers would also help develop the children's number skills.

In RE this week, we started the week with a liturgy about Ascension Day.

Following on from this, we have learned about the events of Ascension Day and through drama, have considered the feelings of the friends of Jesus. The children have also drawn pictures and recalled the events of that day.

Handwriting

This week we worked on revising the curly caterpillar letters, 'c, a, d, g and o,' together with the long ladder letters, 'l, i and t'

Please practise writing the following words to help your child.

If your child finds using pencils difficult, please use other implements such as paintbrushes with water or paint etc... and when working with different tools, continue to encourage the children to form their letters correctly. Thank you.

We have finished teaching the children their Reception tricky words. We will continue to send these home every week and ask you to continue to help your child learn these words by sight. We will continue with regular tricky word activities at school.
