<u>Maths</u> This week, we have been using our addition and subtraction skills to work out simple word problems. We found the key information in the question, circled it and then used this to write a number sentence.

The Gingerbread Man ran away from 13 cows. Then 10 cats added on. How many animals were chasing the Gingerbread Man?

13+ 10 = 23

Why not have a go at this one?


If Mrs Bladon ate 15 Gingerbread Men and Mrs Berry ate 12 more how many Gingerbread Men were eaten in total?
