Romans

English:

In English we will be using the text "The Time Travelling Cat and the Roman Eagle". We will be using this text to write in different styles and link this to our topic. READING FOCUS

- Show I enjoy reading by reading lots of different types of books
- Use my knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to help me read aloud and understand the meaning of new words

COMPREHENSION FOCUS

- Explain what my book is about
- Discuss what words I read excite me
- Understand what I have read
- Ask questions about texts to better understand them
- Work out what a character is feeling by the actions they take
- predict what might happen from clues

<u>RE</u>

Our topic for this first part of the term is all about creation. We will be spending time in the chapel, with Deacon Jeffery and in class to gain a deeper understanding of our topic.

Skills Focus:

- Recognise/ explain how water is a religious sign and symbol and be able to use some religious words and phrases –calling and promises made at Baptism
- Recognise/ explain that people because of their religion act in a particular way (Baptism)
- Talk about their own experiences and feelings about how we participate in God's creation and what sort of people God wants us to be.

Science

Our science topic this half term is going to be Animals including Humans.

Skills Focus:

- Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition and they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.
- Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement

Maths:

This half term we will be focusing on number and place value. We will be working with numbers up to 1000 looking at the place value.

Skills Focus

- Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100; find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones)
- Compare and order numbers up to 1000
- Read and write numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words
- Solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas.

<u>Art and Design:</u>

This half of the term will have a DT focus which links to our Romans Topic.

Skills Focus

- Use research and develop design criteria to inform the design of innovative, functional, appealing products that are fit for purpose, aimed at particular individuals or groups
