Maths

This week we have continued with our statistics work and looked at reading pie charts. We know that the pie chart represents all of the data (100%) and then we can use our knowledge of fractions and percentages to help us read and interpret them.

Literacy and Topic

Literacy

In our literacy we have been writing newspaper reports using the features of recount writing. We have been reporting on the exciting events of last week (Science Week, Netball tournament and Nash Cup). Hopefully some will make it onto the website.

Spelling and Grammar

In our grammar this week we have revisited punctuation to join two main clauses. We know that a conjunction can be used to join two main clauses:
e.g. Tom loved cake but his sister preferred ice-cream.
We also know that the conjunction can be replaced with a ; to join two clauses.
e.g. Tom loved cake; his sister preferred ice-cream.
Also if the second clause further explains the first, a colon can be used.
e.g. The grass needed cutting: it was so long.

We have also revisited pronouns used to replace a noun (eg. He, she, it, my their etc) and possessive pronouns to show belonging (e.g. his, hers, theirs, mine etc).
