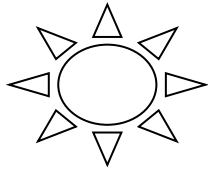


# Summer Week 10 1.7.19

### Spellings

Children will be tested on Mondays

We have changed the way we are setting spellings. The children will all learn the first 5 spellings but then the next 5 will depend on the spelling group they are in. These groups are not fixed and your child may move between the groups depending on how they are doing in the tests. The results to their tests will be sent home every week so you can see how they are doing.

Maths Times-tables results are being sent home. If your child still needs to learn some table facts please can you encourage them to practise? Towards the end of this term nationally all Y4 children will be tested on their times-tables and they are given a times-tables pencil once they know all 144 facts. This week we have tested the children again and the results will be sent home next week.
