School Uniform

It was like walking into a new school on Tuesday! All the children look so smart in the new uniform and the logo helps to unify us all. Please encourage the children to keep up the high standards of appearance - we are very proud of them all.



Reminder of school routines and procedures:



- Medicines: It is probably useful to take this opportunity to remind you of the school policy regarding medicines in school. Only medication prescribed by the Doctor and required to be given 4 times a day will be accepted in school. In such instances, please put one measured dose in a syringe or suitable container and hand it in to the office where it can be stored safely. You will also be required to complete a 'consent form'. Please note that unfortunately we are unable to administer medicine such as 'calpol' or cough medicines.
- Signing in / out during the school day: If your child arrives after 9 a.m. or has to be taken out of school during the school day, please make sure that you sign them in or out at the school office. In addition, if your child is away from school for any reason, please telephone us to let us know the reason for the absence.
- Parking in school: Please note that parking in school is not allowed. The main school gates will be closed and locked to all traffic between the times of 8.40a.m. to 9.15 a.m. and 3.00p.m. to 3.30 p.m. Please do not ask our office staff to unlock the gates during these times. The gates are to be kept locked for the safety of your children. Please be considerate to our neighbours and do not park over or on driveways. We would encourage you to park your car in Chickerell Road and walk up Hardy Avenue.
- Morning routines: Children are able to enter the school from 8.40a.m and go straight to their classrooms. Their teachers will provide them with activities as soon as they arrive. No children will therefore be on the playground at all in the mornings. Parents are asked to leave their child at their usual entrance door and staff will take over. (It becomes very difficult to monitor the children efficiently when the building is full of adults!) We hope these arrangements will help everyone to have a pleasant start to the school day.
- End of the Day: Please could you ensure that your child knows how they are getting home at the end of the day it is very confusing for everyone when arrangements change during the day. Please could you telephone the school <u>before 12pm</u> with any changes to going home arrangements.
- Applications for holiday or leave of absence: There have been significant changes in the law regarding absence from school which come into force this term. Headteachers may no longer grant any leave of absence in term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. This means that no holidays in term time can be authorised. In law, parents and carers are committing an offence if they fail to ensure regular and punctual attendance at school. Therefore any unauthorised absence, such as taking holiday in term time, can result in a Fixed Term Penalty Notice. Failure to pay a Fixed Term Penalty Notice may result in a criminal conviction and a fine in the magistrates Court up to £1000. The Governors have amended our Attendance Policy in light of these changes and we will be using a new absence request form.
