WAGBAT: exploring the qualities of being a witness to Jesus' message.

Read this part of St. Paul's letter to the Colossians about the qualities needed to do God's work.

Colossians 3:12-17 (NIV)

¹²Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. ¹³Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. ¹⁴And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

¹⁵Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. ¹⁶Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. ¹⁷And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

English: This week we are going to be learning about fronted adverbials.

WAGBAT: recognizing a fronted adverbial in a sentence.

An adverb or adverbial describes HOW you do something. For example, the boy walked across the room slowly.

Slowly is the adverb because it describes HOW the boy walked.

If we move the adverb to the front (or beginning) of the sentence, it becomes a Fronted Adverbial.

Slowly, the boy walked across the room.

In this case, the adverbial must ALWAYS be followed by a comma.

WAGBAT: understanding maths vocabulary.

Here are lists of maths words. The 3* list is the list that everyone should know by the end of Year 4 – so that is what you should be aiming for. However, I have taken out some of the trickier ones. You may need to find out what some of them mean if you have forgotten and, remember, they are MATHS words. Please don't tell me that leaves grow on trees...!

Cut them out and put them into groups. Stick them in your book and explain how you have sorted them.

<u>Challenge:</u> Colour code your words by operations. Eg, blue for +, red for x, green for -, orange for division and purple for fractions.
