## \* Seeds (and soil) needed after Easter!\*

After Easter we will be learning about plants for our science work. As part of this we were planning on planting some seeds in school and observing the changes as they grew. It would be great if your child is able to plant their own seeds after Easter to be able to make these observations at home. Sunflower seeds usually work well, but any quick-growing seed will do. If your child is not able to do this, do not worry - we will be planting seeds ourselves and taking photos to share with you.

## RE WAGBAT: understanding how we can follow Jesus.

This week we have learned about the events of Good Friday shown in the Stations of the Cross. We have learned that many people were cruel and mocking towards Jesus, but we have also learned that some people showed him great love and kindness, even though it was risky to do so.

All of these people are following Jesus' example. For today's RE session, I would like you to think about these brave acts of love, and think about what you could do to follow Jesus.

It could be something as simple as trying really hard not to lose your temper with your family members even though they sometimes drive you crazy!

Remember, the real challenge is not to think of a way in which you can show love, but to actually do it!


English WAGBAT: writing an informal letter.

Maths WAGBAT: using mental methods for addition.

Ask your adult to write the numbers from your task onto separate pieces of paper. If you have a printer you can use this egg template

https://www.firstpalette.com/pdf/eastereggs-plain-small9.pdf. If not, you could draw your own eggs for them to use, or simply write the numbers on plain pieces of paper. When they have written all the numbers, ask them to hide the numbered eggs around the house or garden. Make sure you don't peek! When they are hidden, it's your turn to go and find them. Each time you find two numbers, you have to add them together, recording the calculation and answer in your book. Remember to use the different addition methods we have looked at over the last two weeks.
