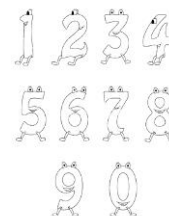

Area and Perimeter

This week we have been looking at the formulas for finding the area of squares, rectangles, triangles and parallelograms. This children have then used this knowledge to calculate the area and perimeter of composite shapes. They have also looked at using this knowledge in a problem solving context, solving word problems about area and perimeter in real life situations.

Spelling and Grammar

Spelling

In spelling this week we have recapped on the homophones discussed last week and have spent time revisiting plural spelling rules (when to add s, when to add es) and rules for using suffixes and what the different suffixes mean.

Grammar

To begin the week we revised some present past and present perfect tense work before moving on to the subjunctive form. The subjunctive form is used in formal situations to express advise or when discussing unreal situations. When giving advise the subjunctive I formed using verb + that.

e.g. It is essential that you practise your spellings.

When discussing unreal situations, the subjunctive is formed using 'were' to express a wish, desire or dream.

e.g. If I were rich, I would....

TASK 3

This term grammar homework will be a combination of revising rules previously learnt to see if they are remembered and consolidating rules learnt in class. Hence please do not be alarmed if the children do not work through their revision books in order.
