Maths WAGBAT: learning about money by handling and sorting coins.

When Jack sold Milky White the cow, his Mother wanted him to bring money home.

This week we will be learning about money in maths and from tomorrow will be counting 1p coins. In preparation for this work, please 12x 1p coins, or cut out 10 small circles of card with 1p written on them to represent 1p coins. Thank you.

After discussing the song, please look at The Resources for Today Section. Here you will find a sheet with British coins and notes.

Talk about these with your child and then look at the activities below.

Please look at real coins with your child. Spread the coins out in front of you and sort them.

Talk about the size, shape and colour of the coins and take time to look for numbers on them.

Explain that the 1p coin is the smallest value and explain that the 2p coin is the same amount of money as having 2 1p coins.

Decide how well your child is coping with this concept and if you feel they understand, talk about a 5p piece being the same as 5 1ps etc...

You could revisit the song at 1 minute 2 seconds and 1 minute 47 seconds to illustrate this point.

***Task

If your child has really understood this concept of different value coins, you could extend them by playing this online sequencing game, where the children are required to place coins of varying values in correct monetary order.

To help us with our topic of 'Growing Up and Moving On,' we'll recap this life cycle and move on to learn about what conditions a plant needs to help it grow.


