Maths.



- Maths is taught daily in Year 5.
- We start each session with a short consolidation task based on the 4 number operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division)
- There will then be a quick reasoning problem before the main body of the lesson.
- This term we will be concentrating on Place Value, number order, addition and subtraction.
- The children will also be expected to use their knowledge in problem solving and reasoning activities.





- English lessons happen daily and include spelling, punctuation and grammar sessions.
- The children will be expected to make their writing more interesting and more detailed using a variety of different methods.
- They will also be expected to write extended pieces of work.
- All the children have been given a handwriting pen already to encourage them to write neatly. So far it appears to be working.

English: reading



- In Year 5, the children will have a guided reading session once a week with me.
- This will include each child reading and then answering questions orally.
- They will also be expected to answer questions independently in their books in another session.


 The children will also be heard to read by Mrs Me-in once a week (hopefully).

Home Reading.



- The children are still expected to read at home to an adult at least 3 times a week.
- The adult should then record this reading in their child's Reading Journal.
- The children have a set of questions for you to ask them at the front of their reading journal.
- The children are expected to change their own reading books once they have finished them.





- Homework is set on a Friday and will be given to the children on the PIPs newsletter.
 These can also be found on the website.
- It is due in on a Wednesday although the children are welcome to hand it in at any time before Wednesday.
- If it is not handed in by Wednesday, then the children will stay in on Thursday lunchtime to do it.

Homework Club

• If there is a problem with homework over the weekend, I am prepared to discuss it with your child during Monday lunchtime, so that they still have 2 evenings to complete it.

 Please don't let homework become a battle.

Spellings:

- Your children have been put into spelling groups and will be given spellings to learn on a Monday.
- There will be a spelling test on Friday.
- The children will have 5 of the Y3/4 or 5/6 spellings to learn and will be told which spelling pattern we are practising. This will also be on the PIP newsletter.
- They will then be tested on the 5 words plus
 5 of the words we've been learning in class.

Our Topic: World War II

- In case you weren't aware.... Our topic is World War II.
- We had an AMAZING time at Nothe Fort which I hope the children have told you about.
- Thank you for the costumes you put together – the children looked like real evacuees.
- There are photos on the website.

World War II

- We will be looking at the War from the angle of the Home Front.
- We will also look at some of the pivotal events but we will avoid too much of the gruesome stuff.
- Our class book is 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll which we have already started and we are really enjoying it. It is set during the War..

Spring Term.



- In the Spring Term, we will be studying Space and the Universe, the planets and how the Earth's movement affects the seasons.
- I hope to ask an astronomer into school to help with our learning. This may involve a small charge (about £2)





- In the Summer Term, we will be studying 'It's a Wonderful World' including habitats and animals.
- We will be reading the book 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo.
- I hope to arrange to go to the Portland Sailing Academy for their Sail for a Fiver morning. This will incur a charge of £5.

PE:

- PE is on Wednesday and Friday.
- Please make sure the children have their kits in school. They will be sent home on Friday for washing.
- As we move into the winter, the children will need some warmer clothes if we go outside.
 Joggers and a fleece are sensible.
- Please make sure long hair is tied up and that earrings are either out or that they have tape to cover them up.

- This all sounds very formal and a lot of hard work. And some of it is....
- However, I try hard to make the lessons as interesting as possible.
- I also try and make sure that the children have different learning experiences during the day.
- And while we do work hard, we have fun too and make time for a bit of a giggle.
