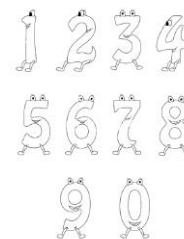

Task 1

This weekend we ask you and your child to go on a number hunt.

Please take time to look for numbers everywhere you go. Look for numerals displayed around the home, in the street, on road signs, on front doors, at the shops, on the buses, basically everywhere.

You and your child can choose how to present your findings.

You could make a list of where you found numbers and what the numbers were on the back of the sheet.

You could be more creative and take photos of places you visited and some of the numbers you found or your child could draw pictures of places they visited with the numbers they found.

We know that weekends are busy, so do not feel that these tasks need to be done at the weekends. Please feel free to hand in the tasks any day during the week. We will always make time to celebrate the work.

Every week we ask you to comment on your child's response to the tasks. This helps us learn about your child's interests and also helps inform our planning for future tasks.
