Shape hunting

Thank you

We have been overwhelmed by the response to the first Parents in Partnership Task and the children have thoroughly enjoyed sharing their work with the class during celebration time.

Task 1

This week we have been carrying out assessment activities to ascertain the children's knowledge of shape names in the environment.

We have gone on to teach the children a shape song to help them identify further 2D shapes.

In order to support your child's learning in this area, in a similar way to the way you went on a number hunt last week, please go on a 'Shape Hunt' as you work together to identify shapes in the environment, both inside and outside.

Please be as creative as you would like in presenting your child's findings. Perhaps your child could draw around shapes they have found, or you could find shape pictures in magazines for your child to cut out. Photographs of shapes in the environment will give your children a starting point for discussion in the classroom too.

Extension

If your child clearly knows their shape names, please extend their vocabulary by getting them to describe the shape in terms of the number of sides it has and whether the sides are straight or curved. You could also count the corners of the shapes and look at whether the sides are equal in length or have some longer or shorter sides.

All this vocabulary work will help your child develop their mathematical understanding.
