Topic news
 Following on from our discussion with the children last term about our new topic called 'Take a Trip around the World,' the children have decided that through learning about countries such as Poland, Portugal, China (incorporating Chinese New Year,) France, Spain and Australia, they would like to find out about the food, customs and animals that live there. We will also be learning about the seas and oceans. If any parents have connections with these particular countries and are willing to come in to talk to the children, you would be most welcome. It has been lovely learning from parents who work in the Emergency/medical professions. We really value your involvement and we firmly believe the children learn so much from these visits.
 We will kick start the topic next week by starting work on 'Where we live' and we will incorporate shape work as we look at the shapes in and around our homes and streets. Any preparation you can do on recapping 2D and 3D shape names and their properties would be beneficial.

Phonics reinforcement.
 Just to remind you, during our daily phonic sessions we sometimes play games to help reinforce the children's knowledge of a particular sound. A website that we use that you may like to look at with your child is <http://www.letters-and-sounds.com/>
