We have continued to teach the children the entry stroke to our pre-cursive script and next week we will be sending home some introductory exercises for you to work on with your child.

Phonics and Word blending

Please note that this week we have added the letters 'd' and 'g' to your child's phonics book. Please spend time looking at 's,' 'a,' 't,' 'p' 'i 'n' 'm' 'd'and 'g' with your child. The children have now been introduced to 9 letter sounds and we have continued word blending activities in our phonics lessons to start the children off on decoding words.

We have looked at 4 new words this week and ask that you look at these together with the 12 words we have so far introduced. Encourage your child to say the sounds and to then blend them together to help them read.

The words are:
