
Maths

This week as well recapping the areas listed on the right, we have worked with the children on number bonds to 10, teaching them how to add two numbers to make 10. We've used numicon (as shown below) and our fingers to help us with this work.

As well as using the area of babies, to help the children develop their speaking and listening skills, some of the children have used this area of our topic to help them develop their writing work.



Maths

This week we have continued revising many area of maths we have worked on over the past few weeks.

These have included:

- Adding 1 more
- Taking away 1.

- Counting in 10s, 5s and 2s.
