Maths.



- Maths is taught daily in Year 3.
- We start each session with a short consolidation task based on the 4 number operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division)
- There will then be a quick reasoning problem before the main body of the lesson.
- This term we will be concentrating on Place Value, number order, addition and subtraction.
- The children will also be expected to use their knowledge in problem solving and reasoning activities.





- English lessons happen daily and include spelling, punctuation and grammar sessions.
- Each lesson begins with a warm up activity.
- This is followed by a spelling and grammar activity.
- This, in turn, leads into a writing activity which, this term will include writing a fact file, letter writing and poetry.

English: reading




- In Year 3, the children will have a guided reading session once a week with me.
- This will include each child reading and then answering questions orally.
- They will also be expected to answer questions independently in their books in another session.
- They will also read with Ms Rogers weekly.

Home Reading.



- The children are still expected to read at home with an adult at least 3 times a week.
- The adult should then record this reading in their child's Reading Journal.
- The children will have their books changed once a week. These books can then be enjoyed more than once so that they children become familiar with them.
- Please ensure that your child's reading record is in school every day, even if it is not your child's book change day.





- The PiP newsletter will be available on the website on a Friday.
- The English and Maths homework has been set for your child on IXL. IXL is an interactive learning platform that can be accessed via a computer, tablet or smartphone.
- The topic homework grid has been set and we will collect the children's work in during the last week of the term.

Our Autumn Topics:

- This will be a Science and Geograhy based topic and we will be investigating rocks, fossils and soils including finding out about Mary Anning.
