Topic News

We have continued work on the Life cycle of a butterfly this week and have linked it to Literacy work on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle.

The children have responded well to their work and have been able to describe the life cycle in some detail.



Next week we will continue work on life cycles by learning about the Life Cycle of a Frog. Any work you can do with your child in preparation for our learning next week would be beneficial. Thank you.

Math:

This week we have continued to work on adding 1 more and taking 1 away 1 from a set of numbers. We have also worked on counting in our 2s,5s and 10s.

To link in with our work on The Life Cycle of a Butterfly, we have worked on pattern making. The children have worked on repeating patterns and symmetrical patterns.
