Dear Parents/Guardians

I hope that you enjoyed the Easter period with your children despite the current circumstances. At least the weather has been kind to us and allowed us to go outside into our gardens, or to go for short walks.

It saddens me to start the summer term in such circumstances where the school is only open to critical key workers' children and vulnerable children, as ordinarily all the children would return to school fully refreshed after their Easter break ready to start the summer term with a 'skip, hop and a jump' so-to-speak, but under the circumstances you and I all know that the only way to keep safe is to abide by the Government recommendations and to only leave the house when it is 100% necessary (grocery shopping and exercise.) You also will have no doubt heard the latest Government news that we are to remain in lock down for at least a further 3 weeks. Despite the recent media speculations, I really do not know when our children will return to school, or what 'returning to school' may look like, but as soon as I do receive news I will obviously inform you of this. In the meantime we are to continue as we are, trying our hardest to support one another not just academically, but mentally as well.

I have spoken to some parents over the Easter period and it has been lovely to hear the positive comments about the homeschooling content and how we, at St. Augustine's, have tried our hardest to support you and your children as much as we possibly can during these unprecedented times. You will have noticed that our 'Homeschooling' tab on our school website has been refreshed with new material to support your children this week. Staff at St. Augustine's are all missing the children and 'normality' very much. To support you further, and in addition to having a direct email to your child's class teacher, your child's class teacher will be calling you this week just to touch base with you all and offer you support and guidance should you need it. It is more than likely that your child's class teacher will call you from a withheld number, so please do not be alarmed. If you are unable to answer the call, they will

leave a message. Our School Office remains open as normal (8.30-3.30pm), and will be answering calls during the normal school day should you wish to speak to a member of staff. We have a minimum amount of staff in school, so it may well be that your child's class teacher is not working in school, but is working from home. Please be rest assured that the staff member will take a message and pass the message onto the relevant staff member, should you not be able to email them directly.
