<b>2 points</b>	Research and bullet point facts on the East India Company	Draw a map of India, labelling major cities, rivers, mountains, surrounding oceans, countries etc.	Draw, paint or use pastels to create tea plantation setting picture.	Design a fruit tea infusion. What fruits/herbs/spices etc would you mix to make a new drink.	Write a diary entry as a child working in a tea plantation in rural India.
<b>5 points</b>	Research how the tea trade industry has developed.	Research a rural and an urban area of India then compare and contrast the two locations.	Design a new front cover for the book Cloud Tea Monkeys.	Make a PowerPoint presentation advertising a holiday to a rural Indian tea plantation.	Write a letter to the 'Overseer' from the book trying to convince him to pay his tea pickers more.
<b>7 points</b>	Research what life was like for Indians living during the rule of the British Empire.	Research the climate of India - investigate seasons, temperature, rainfall and create a climate graph showing your findings.	Research Rangoli patterns and then design your own Rangoli art work.	Research a tradition Indian recipe (you might want to look at breads, curry, flavoured rice etc) and make a dish of your choice. Take photographs and/or write a short description of your dish.	Look at the attached picture of the Indian Jungle. Write a short story imagining you are an animal living in the jungle. What would it be like? What might you do?
<b>10 points</b>	Research the ancient Indian Indus Valley civilization. Produce a short PowerPoint presentation or poster to teach others about this ancient civilisation.	Research the main tourist attraction and produce a tourist guide leaflet outlining the different attractions and what can be seen or done there.	Research henna artwork and design your own henna patterns for a festival or celebration.	Research a famous Indian building or landmark. Make a small model of your chosen landmark.	Write a debate with points for and against opening a tourist attraction at a rural Indian tea plantation.
