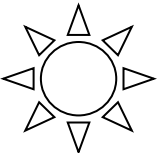

Well, done reception class for this week, you all worked very hard.

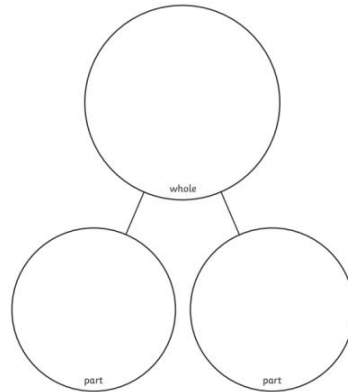

In maths we have started to learn subtraction and using part-part whole models to help us with this. Below are some basic subtraction questions that use their knowledge of number bonds to 10.



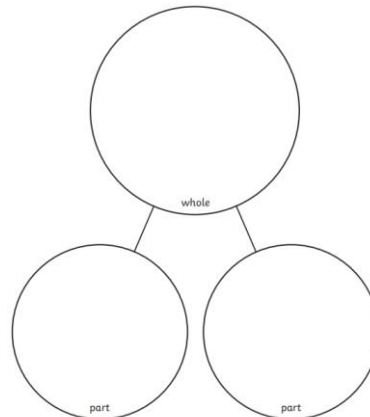
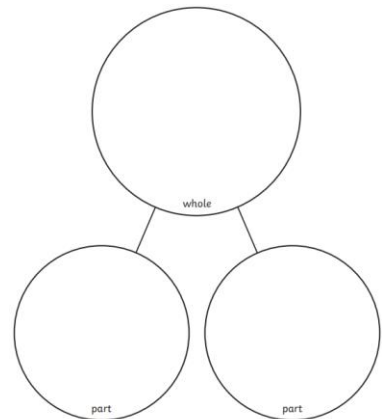
If the children with the party hats got off, how many are left?
