News from across the school and Home learning

Year 1	RWI Word Time Clips to practise with your child over the half term holiday It's been a busy week in Year 1. We have completed our pathways to write unit in English and have thoroughly enjoyed the story, 'Meesha Makes Friends.' This week the children worked on developing their independent writing as they wrote as the character of Meesha as they composed their own diary entries. In Maths we have continued to work on 'seeing 5'in numbers using our Rekenrek equipment and have been continuing work on addition to 10, using our fingers, cubes and number lines to help us add. We thank the families that provided old toys for our history work on Thursday. It was a joy to see the children learn about toys from the past by handling real artefacts. The children's historical vocabulary has developed through this unit and using real toys has brought history to life for our children. We concluded our Computing Unit on developing Mouse skills with the children learning to collaborate to create their own scenes from the 3 Little Pigs on the Chromebooks using the Sketchpad Program. It's been great to see them develop their computer skills over the weeks. In Music we've completed our work on Musical Vocabulary, and the children have used body percussion as well as tuned percussion instruments to learn about rhythm, pitch and dynamics. The children have shown us what great authors they are and they have produced a fantastic Diary Entry in response to our class book, 'Look Up'. When we look at the children's handwriting from the beginning of the year til now the improvement is very pleasing to see and the children really have put in 100% effort with this. In Computing the children have shared their knowledge and understanding of components of technology, ie – wires, batteries, screen etc. In Music they have composed wonderful animal call and response pieces of music.
