NEWS!!!!!! I am delighted to inform you that the Bishop has appointed the Revd. Fr. Anthony O' Gorman to replace me as your new Parish Priest. OPENING UP OF THE LOCKDOWN: With the continued opening up of our Lockdown we shall need the services of Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, both on the altar and in taking communion to the sick & housebound. This is an ESSENTIAL MINISTRY and I ask all those who are willing to continue or to become part of this Ministry to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible.

EXTRAORDINARY MEMBERS OF THE EUCHARIST: As we will be commencing very soon to once more bring Holy Communion to the sick & Housebound, there will be a meeting of **Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist** in the church at **12 mid-day next Saturday**. It is essential that all ministers do their best to attend. Those parishioners who wish to have **Holy Communion** brought to them must, please hand in their names to the Parish Office as soon as Possible.

RETURNING TO HOLY MASS: Although the Bishops have not reinstated the **OBLIGATION** to attend Holy Mass, I would suggest that all start to think and pray about it so that we are able, ready and willing to return to taking up our duties when the time Meanwhile, you are still not obligated to attend Holy Mass at present. Mass will continue to be streamed - if you can, join us by going to the parish website www.ourlady-starofthesea.com and then clicking the link which will take you straight to the live streaming. All who are shielding should continue to stay at home until the Government advises it is safe to venture out.

Needless to say, our church premises and the way they are used must be a safe place, free if possible from Corona Virus, as well as a place of sacredness. We can now allow 50% of our parish church to be used which in real terms means 175 people at any one time. In accordance with diocesan guidelines, the following rules must be STRICTLY adhered to:

- **1.** Entry to the church is by way of the front/main entrance **ONLY**.
- **2.** Exit from the church will be through the side door **ONLY**, and from there into the car park.
- **3.** All notices outlining procedures, including personal cleanliness and social distancing, must be adhered to.
- **4.** If on approaching the church, there seems to be too many people, then please **DO NOT ENTER** but return at another time.
- **5.** Face masks must be worn by all who attend (unless exempt).

NHS TEST & TRACE: In accordance with the Government's guidelines on the need for test & trace, those of you with smartphones can now use the NHS COVID-19 App and scan the QR code at the entrance to St Joseph's removing the need to write your details each visit. Those not using this App must continue to give your details in writing, which will be held for 3 weeks.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Prayer of St. Alphonsus. My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen. (Can be said during Communion)

We also launched a very special project that all our children have become involved in; we received an invitation from CAFOD, the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development, inviting us to become global observers and to create 'decorated eyes' for an Art Installation being prepared for the G7 Summit, so every class teacher shared resources with their classes to help them gain a fuller understanding of the significance of the G7 Summit for the future of our world and the children all created their work which was then sent to CAFOD. To link in with this work, our thought for the week was: This week, the eyes of the world are on the UK at the G7 Summit in Cornwall. How can you stand up for justice for the good of our planet and the good of others? We thank all our children and staff for becoming actively involved and were so proud of the work the children produced, with some of them including very touching messages of hope for the future of our planet. It was great to see our children's understanding of global justice.
