<b>7 points</b>	Make a PowerPoint OR video presentation called 'The impact of climate change'. Explain what Climate Change is, what is causing it, what the impact on our planet it and what we can do to prevent it.	Make a space or WWII-themed game using Scratch. Share a recording on Google Classroom of you playing the game.	Write a song to keep everyone's spirits up during WW2.	Find out the cost of rationed items. How much would you spend on a week's food?
<b>10 points</b>	Visit a local area in your community (beach/town/park) and go on a litter pick with an adult! Make sure to wear gloves! How much litter did you find?	Make do and Mend! Can you use something old to create something new?	Make an air raid shelter / Anderson shelter.
