Create a fact file about London. Include geographical location, population, industries and tourist attractions.	Design a set of postcards for tourists to buy that show the main landmarks of the city.	British Values - Make a leaflet explaining the British Values	Write a diary entry as street child living on the streets of London in the 1860s.
7 points	Research how the two world wars changed London and shaped it into the city as it is today.	Research the London Underground. When was building of it started? How many lines are there today? How does the underground system support the movement of people around the city?	Create a panoramic London skyline image similar to those of Stephen Wiltshire.	To support green cities, cycle to work schemes are becoming more popular. Can you cycle to school for a week or one day each week for the half term?	Do you know anybody that lives or works in London? If so, try to arrange a video call with them and interview them on what it is like to live in the capital city. Write a newspaper article, using their responses, about what life in the city is like.
10 points	Research how London has changed in the last 500 years. Create a booklet or fact file on how the city has changed.	Research the trade and transport links that London has with other cities both in the UK and around the world. Create an information text on London's links with other cities (both in the UK and internationally).	Design a new skyscraper building to be built in London in the style of Zara Hadid. Bonus points if you can make it a green building that supports sustainability.	Over the course of this half term, try to run or walk the total distance of the London Marathon (26.2 miles).	Write your own fictional story about street children in the mid-late 1800s.
