CHURCH OPENING: During this lockdown, public Masses in the Parish will continue at normal times, including at weekends. The obligation to attend Holy Mass on Saturday Evening or Sunday remains suspended for the time being. Mass will continue to be streamed if you can, join us by going to the parish website www.ourlady-starofthesea.com and then clicking the link which will take you straight to the live streaming. All who are shielding should continue to stay at home until the Government advises it is safe to venture out. Needless to say, our church premises and the way they are used must be a safe place, free if possible from Corona Virus, as well as a place of sacredness. In accordance with diocesan guidelines, the following rules must be **STRICTLY** adhered to:

- **1.** Entry to the church is by way of the front/main entrance **ONLY**.
- **2.** Exit from the church will be through the side door **ONLY**, and from there into the car park.
- **3.** All notices outlining procedures, including personal cleanliness and social distancing, must be adhered to.
- **4.** If on approaching the church, there seems to be too many people, then please **DO NOT ENTER** but return at another time.
- **5.** Face masks must be worn by all who attend (unless exempt).

The Parish Hall will remain closed.

NHS TEST & TRACE: In accordance with the Government's guidelines on the need for test & trace, those of you with smartphones can now use the NHS COVID-19 App and scan the QR code at the entrance to St Joseph's removing the need to write your details each visit. Those not using this App must continue to give your details in writing, which will be held for 3 weeks.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Prayer of St. Alphonsus. My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen. (Can be said at Communion)

PARISH GIVING - ANOTHER WAY TO DONATE: My sincere thanks to all of you who have continued to contribute to parish funds during the pandemic. Donating by standing order, annual cheque or using numbered envelopes for the weekly collection continue to be the best ways to donate, though of course your loose cash donations are equally valued. However, we know many now prefer to use card payment methods and no longer carry much cash with them so we have now introduced a cashless donation option. Please be assured that this option is simply for your convenience - there is no pressure on anyone at all to use it. If you currently donate by standing order, annual cheque or gift aid weekly envelopes, then please continue with please do so. The diocese supplied cashless giving equipment consists of a mobile device which allows you to select how much you want to give plus a card reader to take your donation. This will be available in the porch before Mass. It is possible to gift aid your donations by entering some brief personal information and if you require a receipt, you simply need to enter an email address. Once either of these is done, the system will recognise your card and will not ask for the details again. A volunteer will be available for anyone who needs a little help or guidance in using the equipment. <u>**DIOCESE DATES: Pentecost:**</u> Drama, Dance and singing workshops. 12<sup>th</sup> May 7.00 – 8.15 by ZOOM. Continuing with the popular drama and dance workshops, Youth Events will be running these themed on Pentecost. This is jointly run with **By** 

**Design Theatre** and is aimed at young people Yr 6 upwards. Through Zoom, young people will have the opportunity to explore the piece of scripture from Acts about Pentecost. They will be guided to produce short sequences of dance and drama which will be recorded ZOOM. Please get in contact if you are willing to take part. If all remains according to the government road map, it is hoped that in July, we will have a couple of day events at St Rita's in Honiton. On the 10th July, there will be a chance to explore expressing your faith through creativity. Members from the Stay Awake band will join us. This event is aimed at young people aged 10 upwards. On 2<sup>nd</sup> July, there will be a social justice day, Care for Creation. This is aimed at young people 13 to 25. More to follow. **INDIA:** As coronavirus brings devastation across India, CAFOD is working with our experienced sister agency, Caritas India, to provide vital support to poor and marginalised communities, with over £200,000 already pledged. Donations to CAFOD's Coronavirus Appeal will help Caritas India distribute PPE kits to frontline health workers, promote COVID & vaccine awareness campaigns, and set up safely run isolation & quarantine centres. **RECRUITMENT:** Natural Fertility Regulation (NFR) South West is seeking to recruit and train new teachers in the Billings Ovulation Method (BOM) in the Plymouth Diocese. Applicants should, preferably, have personal experience of, or a basic knowledge of, NFR, or be willing to learn and use the method themselves. Training will be by via 10 internet correspondence modules covering 10 consecutive months with 3 study days per year. There is a discretionary cost of £250 to cover resources and training.
