OPENING UP OF THE LOCKDOWN: With the continued opening up of our Lockdown, it is likely to be only a matter of time before we shall need the services of Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, both on the altar and in **taking communion to the sick & housebound**. This is an **ESSENTIAL Ministry** and I ask all those who are willing to continue or to become part of this Ministry to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible.

SICK & HOUSEBOUND: Will those who require and wish to have **Holy Communion** brought to them when we are permitted to do so, please hand in their names to the Parish Office as soon as Possible. **We have now been informed by the Diocese that we can recommence taking Communion to the Sick & Housebound.**

RETURNING TO HOLY MASS: Although the Bishops have not reinstated the **OBLIGATION** to attend Holy Mass, I would suggest that all start to think and pray about it so that we are able, ready and willing to return to taking up our religious duties when the time comes. Meanwhile, you are still not obligated to attend Holy Mass at present. Mass will continue to be **streamed** - if you can, join us by going to the parish website www.ourlady-starofthesea.com and then clicking the link which will take you straight to the live streaming. All who are shielding should continue to stay at home until the Government advises it is safe to venture out. Needless to say, our church premises and the way they are used must be a safe place, free if possible from Corona Virus, as well as a place of sacredness. In accordance with diocesan guidelines, the following rules must be **STRICTLY** adhered to:

1. Entry to the church is by way of the front/main entrance **ONLY**.
2. Exit from the church will be through the side door **ONLY**, and from there into the car park.
3. All notices outlining procedures, including personal cleanliness and social distancing, must be adhered to.
4. If on approaching the church, there seems to be too many people, then please **DO NOT ENTER** but return at another time.
5. Face masks must be worn by all who attend (unless exempt).

The Parish Hall will remain closed.

NHS TEST & TRACE: In accordance with the Government's guidelines on the need for test & trace, those of you with smartphones can now use the **NHS COVID-19 App** and scan the QR code at the entrance to St Joseph's removing the need to write your details each visit. Those not using this App must continue to give your details in writing, which will be held for **3 weeks**.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Prayer of **St. Alphonsus**. *My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.* (Can be said at Communion)

PARISH GIVING – ANOTHER WAY TO DONATE:

My sincere thanks to all of you who have continued to contribute to parish funds during the pandemic. Donating by standing order, annual cheque or using numbered envelopes for the weekly collection continue to be the best ways to donate, though of course your loose cash donations are equally valued. However, we know many now prefer to use card payment methods and no longer carry much cash with them so we have now introduced a cashless donation option. **Please be assured that this option is simply for your convenience – there is no pressure on anyone at all to use it.** If you currently donate by standing order, annual cheque or gift aid weekly envelopes, then please continue with please do so. The diocese supplied cashless giving equipment consists of a mobile device which allows you to select how much you want to give plus a card reader to take your donation. This will be available in the porch before Mass. It is possible to gift aid your donations by entering some brief personal information and if you require a receipt, you simply need to enter an email address. Once either of these is done, the system will

recognise your card and will not ask for the details again. A volunteer will be available for anyone who needs a little help or guidance in using the equipment. INDIA: As coronavirus brings devastation across India, **CAFOD** is working with our experienced sister agency, Caritas India, to provide vital support to poor and marginalised communities, with over **£200,000** already pledged.
