The RE Curriculum and Assessment at St. Augustine's School

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Come and See

At St. Augustine's Catholic Primary School, we use the 'Come and See' Catholic Primary Religious Education Programme from which to plan our RE Curriculum.

Using this programme helps ensure the effective delivery of Religious Education.

Religious Education is taught discretely and developmentally.

It deepens knowledge and understanding of key theological ideas and their application to life.

Children are given the opportunity to apply and use their knowledge and skills in cross curricular studies to help them deepen their understanding of religious truths and think creatively.

Engagement with their own and others' beliefs and values help the children develop good attitudes and dispositions.

Engagement with difficult questions of meaning and purpose help the children think critically.

Children are offered a sense of self-worth through their experience of belonging to a caring community and an awareness of the demands of a religious commitment in everyday life.



Assessment in RE

Teachers carry out ongoing assessments of the children in RE.

The children are assessed using the Age Related Standards in Religious Education which are arranged in age bands, 3-5, 5-7,7-9,9-11.

The children develop their skills in RE by:

Learning about RE - Knowledge and Understanding-AT1

Learning from RE-Engagement and Response-AT2

From Year 3 upwards- Analysis and Evaluation-AT3

Parents are informed of their children's progress in RE at Termly Parent/Child/Teacher meetings and by comments written in their child's annual school report
