Dear Parent/Guardians,

The children and staff have worked extremely hard this half term. I believe that everyone is enjoying a sense of 'normality' within our class bubbles, following control measures and are grateful for an undisturbed half term of learning.

Thank you for attending your child's parent/guardian consultation meeting with your child's class teacher. A whopping 99% of parents/guardians attended. Staff value this time with you as it can make such a difference to your child's learning journey through the school.

## Catholic Life RE

It has been a lively time since we returned to school in March. Through our work during Lent, we were able to celebrate the events of Holy Week virtually, through visiting children enacting the events during special services in their classes.

At Easter, we celebrated the joy of the risen Lord though our classroom RE work and through our weekly virtual Monday Morning Liturgies that led us through Eastertide. Each class participated in their own class Liturgies linked to celebrating the coming of The Holy Spirit at Pentecost. All the classes have also contributed to a beautiful display in the school entrance. Year 4 had an active part in the Easter Vigil at St. Joseph's as their singing was recorded by Mrs Ayles and streamed at Church during Mass. In recent RE work on Witness, the Year 6 children enjoyed interviewing Mrs Wilkins and discussing her vocation and dedication to service in her work at school and also in the parish. The children gained so much from knowing that a staff member dedicates their own time to the service of the Lord and this really helped develop their understanding. We thank Mrs Wilkins for sharing details of her service with these children. Similarly, Mr Brown in his role of Deacon Mark, zoomed in virtually to support Year 3 with the concept of Pentecost within Church, as we were unable to visit Church.

During the month of May we have dedicated time to honour Mary, the Mother of Jesus. The children have taken time to say the prayers of The Rosary and some children have contributed to artwork linked to Mary.

We are delighted that we have been able to recommence our First Holy Communion classes and some of our children meet weekly with their catechists to learn more about their faith in preparation for the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, which will take place later this year.

Father Stephen will be leading Class Mass for Year 5 on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> June and for Year 6 on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July. Sadly, until school guidance changes parents/guardians are not invited to the school site, but we will invite you virtually via a Google Classroom link.

We thank you for your support in helping us deliver our Relationships and Health Education programme. The children are enjoying their learning using the engaging resources from Ten. We will continue to notify you of the learning focus every week via Google Classrooms to ensure that you are fully informed of our learning objectives.

#### Forest Schools

Year 3 recently spent an afternoon in the Forest School area of the field in support with their topic of 'Stone Age.'

The children learnt that fire was important during the Stone Age because it kept people warm, provided light and protection from animals and was used to cook their food. The children were shown how to make a spark with a flint and steel and how that could be used to make a fire.

Some children made dampers using flour, water and sugar, which were then cooked on the fire. They were very tasty - especially with a little bit of jam on them!

The children learnt how to make a shelter using branches and tarpaulins. They discovered that during the Stone Age, animal skins were used to cover their shelters and that it was important to be sheltered from the weather, especially during the Ice Age.

Children learnt that in the Stone Age they painted onto cave walls. Some children mixed up their own paints using mud, grass and water and then painted onto an old sheet.

Everyone enjoyed themselves and learnt a little about what it might have been like to survive with none of the modern comforts of today that we take for granted. We thank Mrs Harrop for supporting the Year 3's with their Stone Age Forest School experience.





In addition to this, the Year 1 Forest Schools after-school 'Class Bubble' club has been going extremely well. Mrs Harrop and Mrs Me-in are really pleased with the children, they have worked together well and produced some excellent dens!
