We have continued to learn to make our sign of the cross and the children have participated in our morning, lunchtime and going home prayers. Every day the children have also participated in quiet prayer time.


The school have focused on the Gospel Value of Compassion this week and our thought for week has been:

This week we have been continued to learn about 2D shapes and have used our knowledge of shape names and their properties to help us learn about Solid shapes.



We have been delighted with the amount of work that has been sent through on the classroom since last week.


Every Friday I ask that you log on and refer to the classwork section where you'll find the 'phonics menu.' As stated in the instructions, please use this week's phonics (shown in this letter and listed on the classwork instructions) and work with your child on one of those tasks. We look forward to seeing the work that you post.



Over the past 4 weeks, we have taught 24 letter sounds as shown above. Please refer to your child's phonics books to see the letters together with the accompanying action. Please revisit these phonemes with your child and encourage them to show you the actions.

This week we have been looking at these words. We have taught the children to blend the sounds to read.
